Les Devoirs Choisis (Choice Homework)

Choose 3 of the following 6 assignments. These will be due **BEFORE 8 am on 11/7**. It would be wise of you to turn them in early just in case you are sick. Even if you are sick, they are still due BEFORE 8 am on 11/7. They will not be accepted after that date and time. Each assignment will be worth 20 points.

Les Devoirs Choisis Un:

• Using 3" x 5 " cards, make flashcards for the words you do not know well from the first 3 stories we have done (Chat, Singe, Livre). The French word should be on one side and the English word on the other side. Minimum of 20 cards.

Les Devoirs Choisis Deux:

• Using a full 8 ½" x 11" piece of unlined paper, divide it into 6 parts. Draw a comic striptype story and write captions under the pictures to tell the story (in French!).

Les Devoirs Choisis Trois:

Using a full 8 ½" x 11" piece of unlined paper, draw and color the flag of a French-speaking country. The flag should be the entire size of the paper. Colors should be what they are in the actual flag. The name of the country should be printed neatly on the back of the paper. You can use the Internet or a World Almanac for your information. You may not use a computer to merely print out a flag. It should be hand-drawn.

Les Devoirs Choisis Quatre:

• Using a full 8 ½" x 11" piece of unlined paper, find a magazine picture and glue it to the paper. Either on the same side (if the picture is small) or on the opposite side (if the picture is almost the whole front) write a 50-word description (in French!) of the picture. You can make up a story to describe it or write sentences about the picture. Proper names and repeated words (like très, très, très, très) do not count.

Les Devoirs Choisis Cinq:

 Make up a crossword puzzle or word search using words from the first 3 stories. Your puzzle should include at least 20 words of more than 3 words. For this time, your clues can be in English. You may use the computer to type this on.

Les Devoirs Choisis Six:

• Using a full 8 ½" x 11" piece of unlined paper, draw a map of a French-speaking country. Label the surrounding countries, bodies of water, mountain ranges and 5 of the major cities (1 should be the capital). Add color to make it look nice. The name of the country should be at the top, printed neatly. You can use the Internet or a World Almanac for your information. You may not use the computer to print out a country outline. It should be hand-drawn.
